**How to Become an
Election Inspector
in Berrien County**

What you need to know about Election Inspectors

Have you ever thought you'd like to serve as an election inspector in your community or wondered what it takes to become an election inspector?

Berrien County election inspectors are all residents of Michigan who were looking for an opportunity to participate in local government. There are 69 precincts in Berrien County requiring well over 1,000 workers, which means plenty of opportunity for you to serve as an inspector in your community. But you don't have to serve in your own community. Election law now allows Michigan residents to serve as an election inspector in any community within Michigan, providing there is a need.



Requirements

- You must be a qualified and registered elector of the State of Michigan.
- You must submit a completed application to the local clerk.
- Challengers, candidates and members of a candidate's immediate family are not eligible.
- Persons convicted of a felony or an election crime are not eligible.

No prior experience is necessary, all necessary training will be provided to you.

These are paid positions; all workers are covered by the federal Minimum Wage Act.

Your local City, Township or County Clerk will be able to answer any additional questions you may have about becoming an election inspector.

Typical Election Day Duties

1. Greet Voters
2. Verify Identity
3. Assign and Record Ballots
4. Assist Voters
5. Reconcile Ballot Totals
6. Deliver Results & Ballots to local Clerk
