Village of Michiana

History

Michiana was one of the last resort communities to develop in the southwest corner of Berrien County because the densely wooded and marshy terrain made access difficult. It was not until 1927 that the area was divided between the states of Michigan and Indiana and developed simultaneously by the Long Beach Development Company.

A tree became the famous landmark for the community. Known as the Signal Oak, the Long Beach Company built an amphitheater around it to entertain prospective buyers with Indian ceremonies. This facility later became a meeting place for the Michiana Community Association that controlled the business of the community.

The Michigan development was the first to be incorporated (1945) and was given the name of Michiana Village. Since then, the Village has evolved from a mere vacation resort to a healthy, year-round, prime location community.

Observations

The Village of Michiana is a small, residential community located on the border of Indiana. It is situated near sandy beaches with homes nestled amidst woodlands and dunes along Lake Michigan.

Michiana is a self-sufficient, strictly residential community that provides no services to non-residents. Although the beaches are open to the public, the Village provides no public parking. Most of the elite lakefront housing units are owned by Chicago residents who enjoy the leisurely life offered by the community. The Village has no lots available for commercial or industrial usage and is committed to maintaining its status quo. Michiana is a quiet, safe, and secluded place for people to live an attractive life.

Community Vision

- To remain a quiet, residential community dedicated to the needs and comforts of its residents.
- Discourage industry from ever entering the Village.
